Wednesday, 15-12-99, 7:30pm:

Across the chain still fairly dry, although to dunk us Rob did try. Rumbling Gut in just two hours, then heading back and to the showers.

California Dreaming next on the list, squeezy, muddy - you get the gist!

Named because they thought they may, perhaps go there soon on holiday.

Dreaming though they must have been, no hippies, flares or sun were seen!

Abseiling down through a waterfall,
Those in the know swung out from the wall.
15 minutes walking a narrow rift,

Zigzagging and crawling with no room to sit, finally we squeezed out the last bit through a hole of such tiny size it sure gave Jodie a bit of surprise.

Moving along down the streambed, I followed Mark then looked at his head-His blue helmet glowed on one side, it was a glowworm hitching a ride. Past an Auckland Uni experiment counting people to measure sediment To see how much movement was occurring, whether naturally or due to cavers stirring.

Downstream Entrance we came out, it was a great cave without a doubt!

Later that day suggested Kevin and Sue, rock-climbing would be a fun thing to do. Climbing above ground was a great idea, seeing as **Froggatts Edge** was so near. That night I drove out with Mark, and climbed the cliffs until it got dark. With birds and a gnome, it's a beautiful spot, I see why the locals come here a lot.

Next day - **Virginia**; rigging a 34m drop, only slightly above ground the rope did stop! Into the Swimming Pool I didn't go, I'm getting so tired I just said no.

Neck deep went Kevin and John into a tunnel and then they were gone.

Half hour later they came back in sight, standing up, I turned on my light.

Heading up now the other way,

I think I was ready to call it a day!

Abseiled up and back for lunch; then out again, 8 cavers in a big bunch. [some big long Maori word] was it's name, it and **Lime cave** are one and the same. Got permission, no problem the farmer said; while I fell asleep in the van instead.

Next day was **Lucky Strike** for John, energetic, with lots of climbing going on! His story soon will be written down, he must have time now he's back in town!

Wellington Caving Group Proposed Change to the Constitution

Introduction

The WCG Committee proposes the following amendment to the Group's constitution by inserting the underlined text in the following section. The amendment limits the period for which a member is able to hold any given elected position.

Amendment

6 **OFFICERS**

- a. The Officers of the Group shall be:
 - (i) President
 - (ii) Secretary
 - (iii) Treasurer (provided that the Office of Secretary and Treasurer may be held by the same person)
- b. If the President cannot attend meetings, a Chairman is to be elected for the duration of the President's absence.
- c. The Officers of the Group shall be financial members of the Group and shall be elected at the Annual General Meetings, except that in the event of the resignation or loss from office of an Officer, the Committee shall have the power to appoint a replacement for the period up until the Annual General Meeting. Such Officers shall be nominated and seconded by financial members of the Group and shall hold office until the next Annual General Meeting, but will be eligible for re-election (provided that no person shall hold any single elected office for more than three consecutive years.)
- d. The Officers elected at the Annual General Meeting shall take office at the end of the meeting at which they were elected.
- e. Officers elected by postal vote shall take office at the following meeting.

Discussion

The committee is concerned that committee members may become 'stale' in their positions if they remain in them for an extended period. By limiting this period it is hoped that Group members will be encouraged to allow themselves to be elected onto the committee, providing new faces and a fresh approach.

The amendment does not prevent an elected member, at the end of a three year term in office from being elected into a general position, or any other elected position.

Voting

We propose discussing this matter at the February and March 2000 meetings, before putting the proposal to a postal vote, to close at the April 2000 meeting. The results and, if passed, the amended constitution, will be published with the May 2000 Sumpthink.
